DID YOU READ THE JANUARY BUGLER? I

hope that you read the January Bugler. Our Newsletter is an IMPORTANT WAY to communicate to all residents and businesses within the boundaries of our Old Spring Branch Civic Association. The Association is an umbrella that helps direct the subdivisions and residents of being aware of what is going on in the Neighborhood.

PLEASE READ THIS BUGLER. IT IS THE COMMUNICATION BETWEEN YOU & US.

We remind the residents of City of Houston Codes and rules of Deed Restrictions. These standards of living, if followed, help keep our properties high in value.

Enclosed in this month's Bugler are rules of Garage/Yard Sales, knowledge of who and what needs a Building Permit to improve your property. Do not be caught in violation of not having a permit. It will cost you a "fine" up to, at least, \$300!

ATTENTION THONIG RESIDENTS

A bit of news from the neighborhood. The resident that lives at 2045 Thonig has purchased 2025 Thonig. He intends to re-plat into four lots in order to build four townhouses. As I understand, it is the vacant area next to 2024 Thonig (where the food trucks were stored). Yeah! OSBCA will insist on the builder following and being in compliance with Thonig Tract Deed Restrictions.

Several properties on Thonig are in violation of the subdivision's deed restrictions. If the restriction was present on the property before 1994, those violations are grandfathered in. However, other residents are ignoring and breaking the deed restriction laws.

If you live in a deed restricted subdivision, please do your part to uphold the deed restrictions. Do your part to follow City of Houston Codes. City of Houston, 3-1-1 inspectors may appear at your door with a citation if you break the city ordinances.

Hopefully, in 2020, you will get involved, pay your membership, and become interested in your Civic Association's purpose.

GARAGE/YARD SALES

Ordinance Highlight regarding Texas Tax Code

As we begin the spring/summer months, garage/yard sales will become a focus. We would like to remind residents of the rules and regulations behind these kind of sales.

Garage/yard sales are not regulated by the City of Houston. The <u>Office of the State Comptroller</u> regulates these types of sales.

Residents are allowed to have <u>only</u> <u>two (2)</u> such sales within a twelve (12) month period.

Any more than two, the resident is recognized as having a business and must obtain a **tax permit** from the State.

Since many subdivisions prohibit solicitation and commercial businesses within residential areas of a neighborhood, such activity is restricted.

For residents who try to operate a business in their homes, there are other city requirements that must be met. Specifically, at a minimum, the resident must obtain a Certificate of Occupancy. There is NO PERMIT known as a "garage sale permit".

The Texas tax code, Title 2, Chapter 151, Section 304 underlines the use of sales tax in occasional sales (too much information for most folks that have only two garage/yard sales a year).

We reported 31.0 patrol hours for the month of January. Remember, criminals don't like to be seen so we need to keep our porch lights on at night.

I'm glad to report we have gotten a new member for our CP group. The patroller's responsibilities are to observe and report situations that require emergency responses by the police. Criminal acts, fire and other incidents affecting public safety fall into this category.

"The presence of the Citizen Patrol program can reduce the opportunity for criminal activity and enhance the general safety of the community."

We are required to have at least 7 members and report at least 30 patrol hours a month. You will be required to pass a background check and attend a short training session to qualify to be a Citizens Patrol volunteer.

TIPS TO AVOID BECOMING A VICTIM OF AUTO CRIME

From Motor Vehicle Crime Prevention Authority

WATCH YOUR CAR

Protect It. It's Yours. Never Unlocked, Nothing in View.

- 1. Hide your valuables from plain sight to avoid attracting thieves.
- 2. Lock your vehicle and take your keys.
- 3. Never hide a second set of keys in or on your vehicle. Extra keys can easily be found by thieves.
- 4. Park in well-lit areas or attended lots. Auto thieves may target unattended parking lots.
- 5. Never leave your vehicle running unattended, even if you will only be away for a moment.
- 6. Don't leave documents with important personal details such as the title or insurance card, in your vehicle. A thief can use these to sell your stolen vehicle. File the title and registration receipt at your home or office and carry your insurance card in your purse or wallet.
- 7. Park with your wheels turned toward the curve and use your emergency brake, making your vehicle less easy to tow away.
- 8. Your vehicle may be more vulnerable when you park it outside. If you have a garage, use it. Lock your garage as well as your vehicle doors.
- 9. Disable your vehicle when leaving it unattended for an extended period.
- 10. Engrave your Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) or personal ID number on expensive accessories and parts.

BUILDING PERMITS: THE CITY OF HOUSTON & DEED RESTRICTIONS

IMPORTANT! Building permits must be in compliance with Deed Restrictions!

In order to protect the neighborhood character and property values, the City of Houston is cooperating with citizens to ensure building permits are not in conflict with deed restrictions. You as a responsible homeowner are required by law to abide by your Deed Restrictions.

Before you begin any construction:

Before you begin any construction or home improvement project, please consult your civic association regarding possible deed restrictions within your area. You may not purchase a building permit without signing a sworn deed restriction affidavit stating that you are aware of and agree to abide by deed restrictions pertaining to your project. That is the law.

Building Permits:

The building permit application needs to have the correct legal description, including the subdivision name and the Deed Restrictions Affidavit on the back of the Permit, must be filled out; (a legal description can be found on the title to your property). Customer Service Representatives will check the subdivision listed on your permit application against a database index of restrictions.

ALL construction projects MUST comply with the community's deed restrictions. If you knowingly, or unknowingly, sign the deed restriction affidavit under false pretenses, you could be subject to municipal court citations, fines, and the removal of the structure or violating portion thereof at any time in the future.

To research restrictions, you can:

- 1. Check to see if a Notice of Restrictions was provided at your closing (required by title insurance in some areas). If not ask your agent to research and provide you a copy.
- 2. Obtain a copy of restrictions from either Harris County Clerk's office or through your Civic Association. Attend our monthly meetings and request a copy if necessary.
- 3. Contact a title abstract company to obtain a copy of the restrictions or a letter stating that there are no restrictions.

Projects that require a permit include:

- New construction of building or structures
- Alterations, repairs or additions to existing buildings or structures. Changes in the use or
 occupancy of an existing building or structure. Interior tenant lease build-outs, remodeling and
 repairs.
- Exterior remodels, alterations or repairs. Moving/relocation existing buildings.
- Demolition (interior and complete buildings).
- Fences over 8' high.
- Driveways and sidewalks (in city R.O.W.)
- Parking lot paving.

If you need clarification concerning fees or have questions concerning building permits, please call 832-394-8852, before beginning any project to be informed.

SPRING BRANCH ISD'S SCHOOL CHOICE PROGRAM

Spring Branch ISD's transfer window has opened. To be considered for a Transfer, an online application must be completed by the required deadline. The application window closes Friday, March 6, 2020, at 11:59 PM. APPLY at https://springbranchisdtransfers.schoolmint.net/

Families may select up to three schools per child; availability varies by school. There are no changes to any application once the application window closes. The application must be completed by the parent or guardian.

The **Dual Language Programs** provides students with an enriched education program that is designed to prepare students for a bilingual education. SCHOOLS: <u>Cedar Brook Elem.</u>, <u>Pine Shadows Elem.</u>, <u>Sherwood Elem.</u>, <u>Spring Forest MS</u>, <u>Spring Woods MS</u>, <u>Spring Woods HS</u>, <u>Westchester Academy for Int'l Studies</u>.

The district partners with KIPP Public Schools and YES Prep Public Schools, each located within a Spring Branch school. **Charter schools** are typically smaller, each with their unique academic and social cultures. Cornerstone Academy (6-8), KIPP Courage @ Landrum Middle School (5-8), YES Prep @ Northbrook MS (6-8), YES Prep @ Northbrook HS (9-12).

International Baccalaureate (IB) schools provide a challenging and varied curriculum, focusing on international relations and international problem solving, creating a love of learning and emphasizing good citizenship. Westchester School for International Studies: MYP (6-10) and IB (11-12).
