We have noticed an increase number of cars parked on the streets. Cars/trucks should have up-to-date inspections stickers and should not be left parked or standing in a public street for longer than 24 hours.

We have noticed an increase of 'graffiti' showing up on fences, buildings and signs. It has led to thoughts: are these signs of a 'gang' operating in our area or hopefully just bored kids. I found an interesting website StopHoustonGangs.org. If you have the time, I encourage you to look up this website. It contains lots of information pertaining to gangs, their criminal activities and ways to report gang activity and remain anonymous, etc. I have included some of the information in the following article (found on page 6) and will follow up with more information in July's newsletter.

We all need to stay alert and report any incidents that seem suspicious. If you see something, please call the Police at 713-884-3131 (their non-emergency phone number). If it is a life-threatening situation, please call 911!

As always, get to know your neighbors, exchange phone numbers, etc. (you don't have to become best friends). We all need to watch out for each other.

DEED RESTRICTIONS

Committee of Five

THE CITY OF HOUSTON SHOULD BE HELPING!

If residents, new and old, have not been advised that they live in a Deed Restricted Subdivision, they are sometimes lead astray by the City of Houston, should they call to determine the legality of a permitted structure on their property.

When calling the City of Houston Permit Dept. or Planning and Development Dept. about any structure one wants to construct on one's property, the City of Houston may say it is legal and NEVER tell one to check with his neighborhood Civic Association or Home Owners Association. This is when residents get in trouble. If legal with the City of Houston, the City of Houston **SHOULD** advise one that he/she should check if it is in compliance with one's Subdivision Deed Restrictions **BEFORE** beginning any project on his property.

An example of this is when, recently, a land owner in a deed restricted subdivision, went to the City of Houston Planning and Development Dept. with the deed restrictions, in hand, and the description of the structure she wanted to build. She was told that she could build. However, a resident in the same subdivision suggested that she present her plan to the Civic Association Deed Restriction Committee before moving forward. The deed restrictions were clearly explained by the OSBCA Deed Restrictions committee, to the property owner. The Planning Dept. had not upheld the subdivision deed restrictions. This improper information would have later involved the property owner with the City of Houston Deed Restriction Legal Dept.

Any violation of established deed restrictions is disrespectful of the "rules" that were voted/approved, by those residents, to govern their neighborhood.

THE GANG THREAT (PART ONE): HOW BIG IS THE PROBLEM?

The FBI says that "gangs are morphing, multiplying, migrating and entrenching themselves in our inner cities, suburbs and rural communities. They are selling drugs to our kids, shooting up our neighborhoods, invading our homes, robbing our banks and stores, stealing our identities, our money, and instilling fear and violence everywhere they go." They are violent and are responsible for committing crimes from assaults to murder using firearms, machetes, fists and blunt objects to intimidate rivals, law enforcement, and the general public. (4) They are sprawling our highways, the Internet, and our communities intimidating and infecting all they come in contact with. In some communities, they are responsible for as much as a staggering 80 percent of all crimes. (1) The National Alliance of Gang Investigators Association (NAGIA) states "The scourge of gangs is a *clear and present danger* to our internal national security and adversely impacts the quality of life within our communities with violence, drugs and associated criminal activities." (5)

There are about 20,000 violent street, motorcycle and prison gangs in the U.S. today containing approximately one million criminally active members - 147,000 of which are currently incarcerated in federal, state, and local correctional facilities. (2) While not all gangs are sophisticated and well organized, they all use *violence* to control neighborhoods and perpetuate their illegal money-making activities. Gangs have also become the primary retail distributors of most illicit drugs. (2)

Gangs continue to pose a serious threat to public safety in many communities throughout the Houston area and the United States.

GANGS ARE NOT JUST AN INNER CITY OR URBAN PROBLEM

Gang movement to suburban areas can be attributed to several factors including the breakdown of traditional hierarchical gang structures resulting from law enforcement targeting of gang leaders, an abundance of wholesale illicit drug suppliers, and the expectation of high profits from new suburban drug operations.

Other reasons include an effort to expand the gang's influence, expanding drug distribution territories, recruiting new members, hiding from law enforcement, and escaping other gangs. As a result, many suburban and rural communities are experiencing ever increasing gang-related crime and violence because of *expanding gang influence*. The movement of gang members to suburban areas result in territorial conflicts between rival gang members and competition for the new territory - suburbia. As gangs grow regionally and nationally, they will continue to meet with resistance by other gangs possibly resulting in drive-by shootings, homicides and other violent crimes - now in suburban communities.

At this moment there are 2 active rental properties in the neighborhood, and none pending.


