Current deed restriction violations:


- Trailers in driveways
- Boat in driveway
- Businesses being operated from residences

City of Houston ordinance violations in our neighborhood:

- Parking on the sidewalks
- Parking the wrong way on street
- Inoperative vehicles on property and parked on street
- Commercial vehicles parked OVERNIGHT on residential streets

However, if you have litter stopping up the drains, coverts and ditches in your area, **PLEASE do your part to clean these areas. Clean your drains. Clean your ditches.** Your help is needed!

We do not have OSB Street Clean Up anymore. It is up to residents to keep their property clean to the center of the roadway on their street. Help!!!!

Follow the heavy trash and recycle schedule found in the Bugler.

LANDSCAPING

Winter is not over! The December Christmas freeze was really a jolt to Houston. We had some summer temperatures in December, but there is still some cold weather ahead. I suspect that we will have at least one more hard freeze. Houston has been known to have freezing in January AND February. Be prepared. Be careful not to trim your plants too soon.

Here are a couple of things you can do during the days we have freezing weather.

- 1. Do not trim/clean/trash any plant that may look dead. Just because the foliage is dead, it does not mean the plant is dead. Wait until spring to see if the plant has any new foliage.
- 2. Give your plants a good soak down before freezing weather. This will insulate the root ball and keep them alive. Cover any tropical/fruit trees and annuals.
- 3. Make mounds around plants with tree leaves to insulate plants.
- 4. Cover plants with fabric/weed barrier material to insulate plants.

I am sorry if any of you got hit with the "pipe breakage" catastrophe. I don't know what your situation was or will be in the future, but I say insulate pipes, turn off water and drain the pipes. If you do not turn off the water, drip them all! Do what you know to do! One is subject to chance in freezing weather. We are warm weather folks.

I want to take this opportunity, again, to thank Bill Cox and LMC for their consistent care for the OSB esplanades at the Wirt Road entrance and the Antoine entrance. OSB appreciates your many years of support and help.

YES! Put these in your recycling bin:

- **Metal and Cans:** Aluminum and Tin Cans. Examples include soup cans, vegetable cans, fruit cans, coffee cans (emptied and rinsed)
- Cartons: Both gable top and shelf-stable food and beverage cartons. Examples include milk cartons, juice cartons, soup cartons, soy milk/alternative milk cartons (emptied and rinsed)
- Glass: Bottles, jugs and jars only (emptied and rinsed)
- Paper: Newspaper, magazines, catalogs, junk mail, office paper
- Cardboard: Cardboard and cereal boxes (emptied of packing materials and flattened)
- **Plastic:** Bottles, tubs and jugs #1 5 and 7. Examples include water and soda bottles, milk jugs, yogurt cups, margarine tubs, detergent bottles, shampoo bottles. (emptied and rinsed)

Do NOT put the following in your GREEN RECYCLING bin:

- Batteries/Electronics
- Shredded Paper
- Tanglers (cords, hoses, wires, clothing)
- Food/Liquids
- Trash and Bagged Recycling
- Furniture and Household Goods
- Scrap Wood and Scrap Metal (NO Helium Tanks)
- Yard Waste
