# FROM THE PRESIDENT

I will begin my message to the OSB community about elections coming up in 2023. The City of Houston citizens will be electing a Mayor, City Council Members and other positions in a general election on Tuesday, November 7, 2023. It is important that citizens get registered to vote for the year 2023. Every year we should confirm our "right to vote" through the Harris County Clerk's Office, 713-755-6965.

To be eligible to vote early by mail in Texas, you must be:

- 65 years or older;
- Sick or disabled:
- Out of the county on election day and during the period for early voting by personal appearance; or
- Expected to give birth within three weeks before or after Election Day; or
- Confined in jail, otherwise eligible.

One of the candidates for Mayor is a former Council member, Amanda Edwards. She will be OSB's guest speaker at our quarterly meeting on April 11. Yes, it is three months away. Therefore, we will keep reminding you every month until then.

**Do you have a 4-legged family member? A dog or a cat.** The City of Houston does have ordinances (laws) concerning your pet. Along with the "POOP" ordinance (picking up your dog's poop outside your property) and the "leash" ordinance (not allowing your dog to run loose outside your property), a NEW **City of Houston ordinance has come into effect as of 2023.** The grace period for this 2022 law has ended.



The worst nightmare is if or when your pet goes missing, having a microchip can make the difference between reunited and never seeing them again. Folks, I am encouraging you, our OSB residents, to abide by the City of Houston Ordinances. Many of our Deed Restrictions are City of Houston ordinances. I try to keep all our residents informed and in compliance with the City of Houston laws. I strongly request that those of us who have Deed Restrictions comply. We, as the Board of Directors of the Old Spring Branch Civic Association, are striving to hold our community to a high and respectful standard.

We should all be committed to helping our neighborhood maintain an attractive and valuable place to live. Please, all of us are responsible for reaching this neighborhood goal.

# COMMON DEED RESTRICTIONS THAT LIMIT PROPERTY USE

You found your dream home. You love the house. You love the neighborhood. You love the limitations. Wait, what? Homebuyers need to be aware of a term called "Deed Restrictions." Deed Restrictions are rules or regulations that pertain to your new home or the plot of land it resides on. Deed Restrictions are commonly recorded in the property's deed. They may have been added by a Homeowners or Civic Association, the neighborhood, builder, however, they in some way restrict something about the property or its use. Most common Deed Restrictions are permanent and are not up for negotiation and everyone must fallow them.

#### **COMMON DEED RESTRICTIONS**

Not every property within our area has Deed Restrictions. Attend the next OSB monthly meeting to find out if your area is Deed Restricted. Often restrictions are imposed to maintain property value. Below, you'll find some of the most common and what they mean for you as a homeowner:

#### KEEP YOUR STUFF OUT OF SIGHT

Often neighborhoods and associations want to keep property values high. One of the easiest ways to do this is to tell homeowners what they can, and can't, keep in their front yards and/or in view from the street.

Most common observed violations within Deed Restricted areas and/or in view from the street would be:

- No 16-Wheel Trucks
- No mobile homes or RVs
- No boats and/or trailers
- No trailers of any kind
- No outdoor storage of trash and/or uncommon personal items in front of the residence
- No trash containers stored in view and/or in front of the residence
- No temporary structures or temporary carport
- No cars with expired registration stickers or no license plate; cars that that don't run and/or are not in service, etc.

These restrictions generally don't make stipulations based on condition of the item either. If you're not

#### **BUSINESS IS BUSINESS**

Some common Reed Restrictions prohibit running a business out of your home or erecting signs in your yard of any type. Others limit your ability to parcel and/or subdivide your lot and sell it to others. The growing popularity of companies like Airbnb, have brought into question a homeowner's ability to rent out his/her home for a day at a time in some areas as well. Knowing what can and can't be done in and around your home is important to be respectful to your neighbors, not receive Deed Restriction Violation Notices and/or possible litigation.

#### **DETAILS MATTER**

Some Deed Restrictions cover general property appearances such as a portion of the veneer must consist of brick or stone material, deteriorated siding and/or trim paint conditions, etc. Some communities require each home be a minimum size or on a minimum size plot (so that homes aren't clustered together or too tall). Most of these restrictions were put in place long ago to safeguard our property value.

#### HOW DO I KNOW THE LIMITATIONS ON MY PROPERTY?

When you're ready to buy a home in a certain area don't go into the process unaware. Obtain a title search from a reputable title company. Find out if there is a Civic or Homeowners Association. Ask if there are Deed Restrictions within the area before purchasing. When you find the home of your dreams, work with a Realtor and/or title company to ensure you know everything about the residence before buying. These Professionals should explain the Deed Restrictions on your property and what it means for your use. Some restrictions may already be known but having the information before you sign the documents will help you understand any limitations you might face as owners.

## BEAUTIFICATION & LANDSCAPING

I am going to take this opportunity to combine our efforts to keep our neighborhood attractive through a well-groomed winter yard and picking up litter from our property to the middle of the street. Carry a litter bag in your car. Bring your litter home and put it in the trash.

The "Yards of the Month" will resume in April. However, the lawn will continue to grow slowly, and leaves will fall from trees until bare. Therefore, I suggest residents mow/mulch leaves, edge and weedeat their yards at least every two (2) weeks.

Yard clippings, in City of Houston approved bags, and bundled/tied small branches should be picked up on Fridays along with garbage. Call 3-1-1, if not.

#### Remember to take down your Christmas lights.

Protect your plants from freezing. Cut back on watering your lawn. The area has had and will have more rain than usual. Apply fungicide to keep "brown patch" in check. Fertilize with Micro Life 8-12-16.

**WAIT, wait to cut back** shrubs, flower beds, etc., until after the weather begins to warm and continues to stay above freezing conditions.

Thank you, LMC for continuing to maintain our two esplanades: Hammerly & Wirt and Antoine & Long Point. You are appreciated. Thank you, Nino for maintaining our drip/sprinkler systems at both locations. You, too, are appreciated.

# YES! Put these in your recycling bin:

- **Metal and Cans:** Aluminum and Tin Cans. Examples include soup cans, vegetable cans, fruit cans, coffee cans (emptied and rinsed)
- Cartons: Both gable top and shelf-stable food and beverage cartons. Examples include milk cartons, juice cartons, soup cartons, soy milk/alternative milk cartons (emptied and rinsed)
- Glass: Bottles, jugs and jars only (emptied and rinsed)
- Paper: Newspaper, magazines, catalogs, junk mail, office paper
- Cardboard: Cardboard and cereal boxes (emptied of packing materials and flattened)
- **Plastic:** Bottles, tubs and jugs #1 5 and 7. Examples include water and soda bottles, milk jugs, yogurt cups, margarine tubs, detergent bottles, shampoo bottles. (emptied and rinsed)

# Do NOT put the following in your GREEN RECYCLING bin:

- Batteries/Electronics
- Shredded Paper
- Tanglers (cords, hoses, wires, clothing)
- Food/Liquids
- Trash and Bagged Recycling
- Furniture and Household Goods
- Scrap Wood and Scrap Metal (NO Helium Tanks)
- Yard Waste
