Those who continue NOT to get in compliance with your subdivision deed restrictions are a nuisance to


those who DO respect the "laws of the land". These residential "laws" were established by previous and founding residents that wanted to keep the neighborhood respectful and property values high.

## BUILDING PERMITS: THEY CITY OF HOUSTON & DEED RESTRICTIONS

## IMPORTANT!!! Building permits must be in compliance with Deed Restrictions!!!

In order to protect the neighborhood character and property values, the City of Houston is cooperating with citizens to ensure building permits are not in conflict with deed restrictions. You as a responsible homeowner are required by law to abide by your Deed Restrictions.

### Please be informed before you begin any construction:

Before you begin any construction or home improvement project, please consult your civic association regarding possible deed restrictions within your area. You may not purchase a building permit without signing a sworn deed restriction affidavit stating that you are aware of and agree to abide by deed restrictions pertaining to your project. That is the law.

## **Building Permits:**

The building permit application needs to have the correct legal description, including the subdivision name and the Deed Restrictions Affidavit on the back of the Permit, must be filled out; (a legal description can be found on the title to your property). Customer Service Representatives will check the subdivision listed on your permit application against a database index of restrictions. **ALL construction projects MUST comply with the community's deed restrictions. If you knowingly, or unknowingly, sign the deed restriction affidavit under false pretenses, you could be subject to municipal court citations, fines, and the removal of the structure or violating portion thereof at any time in the future.** 

### To research restrictions, you can:

- 1. Check to see if a Notice of Restrictions was provided at your closing (required by title insurance in some areas). If not ask your agent to research and provide you a copy.
- 2. Obtain a copy of restrictions from either Harris County Clerk's office or through your Civic Association. Attend our monthly meetings and request a copy if necessary.
- 3. Contact a title abstract company to obtain a copy of the restrictions or a letter stating that there are no restrictions.

### Projects that require a permit include:

- New construction of building or structures
- Alterations, repairs or additions to existing buildings or structures. Changes in the use or
  occupancy of an existing building or structure. Interior tenant lease build-outs, remodeling and
  repairs.
- Exterior remodels, alterations or repairs. Moving/relocation existing buildings.
- Demolition (interior and complete buildings).
- Fences over 8' high.
- Driveways and sidewalks (in city R.O.W.)
- Parking lot paving.

If you need clarification concerning fees or have questions concerning building permits, please call 832-394-8852, before beginning any project to be informed.

## CRITERIA FOR YARDS OF THE MONTH

Below is Old Spring Branch's guide for getting your yard placed in the "Yards of the Month" list. *Save this for your future use.* Thanks to Campbell Woods for use of its yard criteria.

#### Criteria:

- Green, mowed and edged
- General neatness (no visible garbage or clutter)
- Shrubs and trees neatly pruned
- Walks, driveways and curbs swept and clean
- Nice overall landscaping design
- Color contrast (flowers, shrubs, etc.)
- City of Houston codes and OSB Deed Restrictions must be observed

#### In addition:

- No dead plants
- No out of season Christmas lights
- Buildings, fences, porches and patios in good repair
- Have no indoor furniture on porches or patios
- Must be attractive and pleasing to the eye

Yards of the month will begin appearing in the May issue of the Bugler (this means the yards from April). The Yard Hawk is really going to be stricter this coming year. Following all the criteria really means a lot of work for the homeowner. Not every yard will have ALL the criteria. However, the obvious points can be met.

Did you know that reporting your concerns via 3-1-1 is the fastest way to address your issue and track the resolution? The City of Houston tracks those calls which provide vital information needed to properly address an issue.

## **BEAUTIFICATION**

Thank you, LMC, for taking care of our OSB Esplanades at Hammerly/Wirt Rd. and Antoine/Long Point. Thank you, Nino Roman for taking care of our irrigation systems on our esplanades.

The Solid Waste Dept. has been pretty good about picking up Heavy Trash and has been on schedule for garbage and recycling. It is still important that we, as residents, do our part. Place those garbage and recycle containers at least 3 feet apart when put on curb-side.

In addition, PLEASE follow the Heavy Trash schedule. If in doubt, call 3-1-1 as to what heavy trash is to be picked up that particular month. A lot of yard work is going on. Remember, to have yard clippings, leaves, weeds, etc., picked up, one must place them in City of Houston, approved 100% compost-able lawn and leaf bags.

I have found that the best such bags are found at Home Depot. They are 33 gal in size, 20 in a box, @ 12.?? A box. EcoGuard brand. These bags are collected every Friday. BLACK BAGS ON CURBSIDE = GREEN TAGGED... NO PICK-UP.

Don't be guilty of putting these black bags in the garbage bin. Yep, we have all been guilty of doing it. It is against City of Houston code. Please use the approved leaf bags.

Tied Bundles of tree limbs and bushes, 3-4 foot in length, no more than 40# in weight, should also be collected on Fridays. Call 3-1-1 if not collected.

Thank you, residents, for picking up litter in your yards, ditches, and streets. We are all responsible for keeping our neighborhood clean and attractive.

## GARAGE/YARD SALES - ONLY TWO (2) A YEAR

As we begin the spring/summer months, garage/yard sales will become a focus. We would like to remind residents of the rules and regulations behind these kinds of sales.

Garage/yard sales are not regulated by the City of Houston. The Office of the State Comptroller regulates these types of sales. **RESIDENTS ARE ALLOWED TO HAVE ONLY TWO (2) SUCH SALES WITHIN A TWELVE (12) MONTH PERIOD.** Any more than two, the resident is recognized as having a business and must obtain a tax permit from the State. Since many subdivisions prohibit solicitation and commercial businesses within residential areas of a neighborhood, such activity is restricted. For residents who try to operate a business in their homes, there are other city requirements that must be met. Specifically, at a minimum, the resident must obtain a Certificate of Occupancy. There is NO PERMIT known as a "Garage sale permit".

The Texas tax code, Title 2, Chapter 151, Section 304 underlines the use of sales tax in occasional sales (too much information for most folks that have only two garage/yard sales a year).

## YES! Put these in your recycling bin:

- Metal and Cans: Aluminum and Tin Cans. Examples include soup cans, vegetable cans, fruit cans, coffee cans (emptied and rinsed)
- Cartons: Both gable top and shelf-stable food and beverage cartons. Examples include milk cartons, juice cartons, soup cartons, soy milk/alternative milk cartons (emptied and rinsed)
- Glass: Bottles, jugs and jars only (emptied and rinsed)
- Paper: Newspaper, magazines, catalogs, junk mail, office paper
- Cardboard: Cardboard and cereal boxes (emptied of packing materials and flattened)
- **Plastic:** Bottles, tubs and jugs #1 5 and 7. Examples include water and soda bottles, milk jugs, yogurt cups, margarine tubs, detergent bottles, shampoo bottles. (emptied and rinsed)

## Do NOT put the following in your GREEN RECYCLING bin:

- Batteries/Electronics
- Shredded Paper
- Tanglers (cords, hoses, wires, clothing)
- Food/Liquids
- Trash and Bagged Recycling
- Furniture and Household Goods
- Scrap Wood and Scrap Metal (NO Helium Tanks)
- Yard Waste
