
Yearly membership dues are \$25 and \$12.50 for senior citizens or for those on fixed income.

CRIME REPORTS – AUGUST 2022

I regret that I am not able to provide you with a current report of Incidents Filed with HPD for July and August 2022. For some reason the format for the incident reports has been changed and I just could not get it to work. I will keep trying so maybe in a future newsletter, I will be able to get the information I normally provide. Listed below are the Incident reports that I was able to locate.

- Three reports of Aggravated Assault: August 15th, 12PM, 2000 Block of Antoine; August 25th, 7PM, 2000 Block of Harland and August 29th, 1AM, 2000 Block of Antoine.
- One report of Breaking & Entering: August 7th, 10PM, 7800 Block of Hammerly (Commercial).
- Two reports of Robbery: August 13th, 9PM, 7500 Block of Long Point and August 29th,5PM, 7800 Block of Long Point. Both incidents were commercial stores.

ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICE CENTER & REUSE WAREHOUSE

The Environmental Service Center (ESC), 11500 Post Oak Rd, Houston, TX 77035, is open Tues & Wed, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. and the second Sat. of each month, 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Residents may pick up free paint and household chemicals every Fri, 9 a.m. to noon. The ESC provides a drive through, drop-off site for Houston residents to bring their household hazardous waste (HHW) and residential electronic waste.

The ReUse Warehouse, 9003 North Main St., Houston, TX 77022, is open Tues to Fri, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., and every 2nd and 4th Sat, from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. It is closed Sun to Mon. The Building Materials Reuse Warehouse benefits the community by providing space for excess building materials that would otherwise be dumped in local landfills. They accept material from individuals, supply companies, and builders, and make it freely available for reuse by any non-profit organization.

YES! Put these in your recycling bin:

- Metal and Cans: Aluminum and Tin Cans. Examples include soup cans, vegetable cans, fruit cans, coffee cans (emptied and rinsed)
- Cartons: Both gable top and shelf-stable food and beverage cartons. Examples include milk cartons, juice cartons, soup cartons, soy milk/alternative milk cartons (emptied and rinsed)
- Glass: Bottles, jugs and jars only (emptied and rinsed)
- Paper: Newspaper, magazines, catalogs, junk mail, office paper
- Cardboard: Cardboard and cereal boxes (emptied of packing materials and flattened)
- **Plastic:** Bottles, tubs and jugs #1 5 and 7. Examples include water and soda bottles, milk jugs, yogurt cups, margarine tubs, detergent bottles, shampoo bottles. (emptied and rinsed)

NO! Do **NOT** put these in your recycling bin:

- Batteries/Electronics
- Shredded Paper
- Tanglers (cords, hoses, wires, clothing)
- Food/Liquids

- Trash and Bagged Recycling
- Furniture and Household Goods
- Scrap Wood and Scrap Metal (NO Helium Tanks)
- Yard Waste

BEAUTIFICATION

Let's not forget, OSB residents, what it takes to keep our neighborhood clean and attractive. Every aspect of your property adds to the beauty of your subdivision.

Each of us must remember that we are responsible for upholding deed restrictions and City Ordinances.

It is sad to see violations such as, littered yards, ditches, trailers, boats, inoperable vehicles stored in driveways, putting heavy trash curbside too early, to name a few. If everyone, 375 properties, did as above, this OSB area would look like a "landfill". Such violations, in our neighborhood, bring down our property value, believe it or not.

3-1 -1 reports have been filed and notices of violation have been sent directly to residents. Please, please, respect the laws and get into compliance. Help keep our OSB from turning into a "Dumpster".

LANDSCAPING/YARDS

Well, it looks like the recent rain has saved the remaining scrubs and grass from "death". Yep, now is the time to pull dead plants out and rake dead grass into the recycle yard bags. New grass will grow faster if old dead grass is scrapped out.

It is a good idea to take precautions against rub worms, ants, and other lawn bugs during the September – October months. Hopefully, the water bill will go down and the rain will come at better intervals. Be careful, not to let grounds dry out too much.

Keep chasing that lawn mower. Mowing at 3-3 ½ inches will help conserve the moisture to your grass/soil. Trim back wild scrubs back neatly. Remember bundled tied limbs are picked up on Fridays along with Recycle disposable yard bags.

Thank you, LMC and Nino, for keeping OSB esplanades alive during the draught season. Your time is much appreciated. OSB is "lucky" to have your service.


