# FROM THE PRESIDENT

I will begin my message to the OSB Community about elections coming up in 2024. It is important for citizens to get registered to vote for the year 2024. Every year we should confirm our "right to vote" through the Harris County Clerk's Office, 713-755-6965. The deadline for being registered to vote for 2024 is **Tuesday**, **February 6**, 2024.

#### To be eligible to vote by mail in Texas, you must be:

- 65 years or older;
- Sick or disabled;
- Out of the county on election day and during the period for early voting by personal appearance; or
- Expected to give birth within three weeks before or after Election day; or
- Confined in jail, otherwise eligible

You must be registered to vote in the March 5<sup>th</sup> Primary Election. The State law requires you to register 30 days prior to the Election. Confirm your voter register status by searching for it on the Harris County Clerk's Office, 713-755-6965 or email <u>voters@Harrisvotes.com</u>.

A reminder that the City of Houston does ordinances (laws) concerning your pet. Along with 1) the "POOP" ordinance (picking up your dog's poop outside you property); 2) the "leash" ordinance (not allowing your dog to run loose outside your property) and 3) the newish law in effect is mandatory microchips. Contact BARC at 713-229-7342 or go by 3300 Carr St. to get your pet a microchip for \$15.

# **BEAUTIFICATION & LANDSCAPING**

WAIT! WAIT! Cut back shrubs, flower beds, etc., until after the weather begins to warm and continues to stay above freezing conditions. Weather man predicts another freeze around February 14, as of January 30, 2024.

Protect your plants from freezing. Cut back on watering your lawn. The area has had and will have more rain than usual. Apply fungicide to keep "brown patch" in check. Fertilize with Micro Life 8-12-16.

## Remember to take down your Christmas lights!

The "Yards of the Month" will resume in April. However, the lawn will continue to grow slowly, and leaves will fall from trees until bare. Therefore, I suggest residents mow/mulch leaves, edge and weedeat their yards at least every two weeks.

Call 3-1-1 if you have any problem drainage, etc. It is YOUR reasonability to clear your drain in front of your property. Report your own problems. Get a SR# from 3-1-1. Refer to that number each time you check on the situation.

Thank you, LMC for continuing to maintain our two esplanades: Hammerly/Wirt Rd and Antoine/Long Point. You are appreciated. Thank you, Nino for maintaining our drip/sprinkler systems at both locations. You, too, are appreciated.

# RESIDENT HOUSE NUMBER - OSB "ENTRY TO WIN" DRAWING

OBJECT OF THE "ENTRY TO WIN" is to encourage every single family resident property to be in compliance with the City of Houston HOUSE NUMBER ORDINANCE (as was posted in the January hard copy Bugler).

TWO (2) \$100 DRAWINGS to be held in April 2024. Winners will be contacted in April.

RULES OF THE OSB DRAWING: (We, OSBCA may have modified the Ordinance somewhat).

- 1. Numbers must be at least 3" tall.
- 2. Numbers must be in contrasting color.
- 3. Numbers must be posted to be seen from the street (day or night).
- 4. Numbers may/can be posted on front (fascia of house), carport, or garage.
- 5. Painted curb numbers are NOT eligible.
- 6. Board Members are NOT eligible for drawing, but must be in code compliance.
- 7. Properties in Deed Restriction violation do NOT qualify until property is in compliance.
- 8. Any objects obstructing the address numbers should be removed so address numbers can be seen from the street.
- 9. Drawings will be made in April 2024. Winners will be contacted in April.

Every Resident House Number that meets the Criteria (1-9) has been and is being entered in the drawing. The Board of Directors will continue to drive through the neighborhood writing your eligible house number down on an entry blank and depositing it in a draw container.


Hello everyone! As of February 1, we have 50 members, thank you ALL so much for the support. It helps more than you think.

# CITIZENS ON PATROL – JANUARY 2024

Happy Valentines Day! We reported a total of **29 patrol hours for December** and a total of **33.5 patrol hours for January**. As always, I want to thank our Citizens on Patrol (CP) volunteers for patrolling our area whenever possible. I do believe we make a difference. We are always looking for volunteers to join our CP group. If you are interested, feel free to contact Virginia at 832-748-8088, please leave a message. We would love to have you!

Lots of new construction going on in the neighborhood! Two gated communities on Johanna and Amelia and a very large apartment complex on Antoine and Hammerly are in the process of being built. There is also a large building being constructed on Antoine, not quite sure what it is going to be yet (maybe I will know something next month). My latest pet peeve is the gated community on Jacquelyn and Amelia by Treasure Forest Elementary. For some unknown reason, they leave their trash cans on the street seven days a week and 24 hours a day. All other gated communities have their garbage collected by a private contractor and I don't know why this community is not doing that also. I have reported it the city twice and our president has reported it several times. The city has posted the yellow 'citation' signs and their last effort, they attached the citation signs to the actual garbage cans. However, the 'cans' remain on the streets! We will keep working on getting the trash cans placed where they belong, not on the street! And yes, I know this problem doesn't fall under 'Citizens on Patrol' but it is such a sore sight to see when we are patrolling and we are not talking about one or two cans, my last count was 22 (and 5 were either dumped over or in the ditch).

As always, be aware of your surroundings! Stay alert, be diligent and report any incidents that you see or hear. If the police department is not aware of anything going on in our neighborhood, they will not patrol our area. You can call the non-emergency number at 713-884-3131. If it is life-threatening situation, please call 911!

# WHAT ARE DEED RESTRICTIONS?

We always want you, as residents, to understand why we are so persistent about upholding deed restrictions in our community.

Deed restrictions are written agreements that restrict, or limit, the use of activities that may take place on property in a subdivision. These restrictions appear in the real property records of the county in which the property is located. They are private agreements and are binding upon every owner in a subdivision. All future owners become a party to these agreements when they purchase property in deed restricted areas.

A primary purpose of most deed restrictions is preserving the residential character of a subdivision by keeping out commercial and industrial facilities. For people who prefer to live in a wholly residential environment, deed restrictions are desirable.

Deed restrictions may legally prohibit a person from operating certain types of businesses from their home. In Houston, where property is not governed by deed restrictions, a property owner may be free to operate a commercial business in the neighborhood. Deed restrictions are powerful tools to help preserve the character of a subdivision or neighborhood.

Every homeowner should have received a copy of deed restrictions upon purchase. However, it has been brought to OSBCA's attention, that this is not happening.

If you did not receive a copy of your deed restrictions when closing on your home, or have not received a copy from the Deed Restriction Committee, if sent a violation letter, one may obtain a copy from the Harris County Clerk at (713-755-6411), visit their web site at <a href="mailto:cclerk.hctx.net">cclerk.hctx.net</a>, OR visit our (OSBCA) website OldSpringBranch.org/deed-restrictions.

Please read your deed restrictions to be in compliance. Contact an OSB Civic Association board member (found in the Bugler newsletter) before beginning any new construction and/or remodeling.

We are striving to make OSB a desirable community in which you enjoy living. Be proud of your subdivision and abide by the deed restrictions. Your property value is important.

- **Cartons**: Both gable top and shelf-stable food and beverage cartons. Examples include milk cartons, juice cartons, soup cartons, soy milk/alternative milk cartons (emptied and rinsed)
- Glass: Bottles, jugs and jars only (emptied and rinsed)
- Paper: Newspaper, magazines, catalogs, junk mail, office paper
- Cardboard: Cardboard and cereal boxes (emptied of packing materials and flattened)
- **Plastic**: Bottles, tubs and jugs #1 5 and 7. Examples include water and soda bottles, milk jugs, yogurt cups, margarine tubs, detergent bottles, shampoo bottles. (emptied and rinsed)

# NO! Do **NOT** put these in your GREEN RECYCLING bin:

- Batteries/Electronics
- Shredded Paper
- Tanglers (cords, hoses, wires, clothing)
- Food/Liquids; Trash and Bagged Recycling
- Furniture and Household Goods
- Scrap Wood and Scrap Metal (NO Helium Tanks)
- Yard Waste
