CRITERIA FOR YARDS OF THE MONTH

Be well-groomed (i.e. yard mowed, sidewalks edged, shrubs/trees pruned, flower beds weedfree, no dead plants)

Be attractive, neat and pleasing to the eye (i.e. green lawn, variety of plants/flowers, color contrast in landscaping, walkway/driveway/curb clean, no out-of-season decor)

Have buildings, fences, porches and patios in good condition (i.e. minimal distraction from the landscape due to deterioration, damage/construction)

Be free of litter, junk and debris (no appliances or indoor furniture on porches or patios; free of junked or inoperable vehicles; no parking on the lawn)

Observe all City of Houston Codes and OSB Deed Restrictions

THE IMPORTANCE OF DEED RESTRICTIONS

Committee of Five

At the Old Spring Branch Civic Association (OSBCA), we are committed to upholding deed restrictions because they play a key role in maintaining the quality and character of our community. Here's why they matter and how they affect you as a homeowner.

What Are Deed Restrictions?

Deed restrictions are legally binding rules that govern the use of properties within a subdivision. They are recorded in the county's property records and apply to every homeowner, including future buyers. By purchasing a home in a deed-restricted area, you agree to follow these rules.

The main goal of most deed restrictions is to maintain the residential nature of a neighborhood by preventing commercial or industrial development. For those who value a peaceful, residential environment, these restrictions help protect that atmosphere.

How Deed Restrictions Impact You

Deed restrictions can prevent homeowners from running certain types of businesses out of their homes. For example, in areas without these restrictions, businesses might operate freely within residential neighborhoods. In contrast, deed restrictions provide communities with control over activities that could disrupt the neighborhood's character.

If you didn't receive a copy of your deed restrictions during your home purchase or after receiving a violation notice, you can obtain them through several sources.

Accessing Your Deed Restrictions

To obtain a copy of your deed restrictions:

- Contact the Harris County Clerk at (713) 755-6411 or visit www.cclerk.hctx.net.
- Visit the OSBCA website at OldSpringBranch.org and search for your subdivision's restrictions.

We recommend all homeowners review these documents to ensure compliance. Before starting any new construction or remodeling, consult an OSB Civic Association board member (listed in the Bugler newsletter) to avoid potential violations.

We are all responsible for keeping Old Spring Branch a desirable place to live. By following deed restrictions, you contribute to the beauty and harmony of the neighborhood while protecting your property value. Let's continue to take pride in our community by respecting these important guidelines.

BEAUTIFICATION

OSB is getting closer to becoming "free" of storm debris and junk lining the streets, ditches, and curbs. Excitement in our neighbor has been to see the black trailer trucks drive though our streets. Also, seeing the City of Houston Solid Waste trucks come on schedule days.

Gosh, folks, OSB has been so trashed out for SO long, please follow the Solid Waste Heavy Trash schedule and put the correct HEAVY TRASH out NO EARLIER **than a week ahead.**

Taking care of our lawns is important right now. Lawns will soon start to go dormant. Watering will be needed if rain does not come soon. Doctor those bugs and watch for fungus in your lawn. Mowing at 3" will help keep your grass from drying out too soon after watering.

Residents, please do your part to keep your property clear of litter, stored junk in sight from street, and parking in the yard. In addition, pull garbage and recycle bins from the street after collection and place them out of sight until next collection. To prevent bins from spilling, place the bins at least 3' apart so the truck "jaws" can pick up bins without hitting the other.

LANDSCAPING

First, I would like to thank Bill Cox for having LMC mow, edge and pick up litter regularly from the Hammerly medians from Wirt Rd to Woodvine. OSBCA appreciates your long-time support.

The Hammerly/Wirt Rd esplanade has its sprinkler system ready to go. The bed will have Flax Lilies planted soon. Thank you, Nino. It has been a sad scene there for months. The Crape Myrtles that were planted on the Hammerly medians in April have survived the summer heat. Metal and Cans: Aluminum and Tin Cans. Examples include soup cans, vegetable cans, fruit cans, coffee cans (emptied and rinsed) Cartons: Both gable top and shelf-stable food and beverage cartons. Examples include milk cartons, juice cartons, soup cartons, soy milk/alternative milk cartons (emptied and rinsed) Glass: Bottles, jugs and jars only (emptied and rinsed)

Paper: Newspaper, magazines, catalogs, junk mail, office paper **Cardboard**: Cardboard and cereal boxes (emptied of packing materials and flattened)

Plastic: Bottles, tubs and jugs #1 - 5 and 7. Examples include water and soda bottles, milk jugs, yogurt cups, margarine tubs, detergent bottles, shampoo bottles. (emptied and rinsed)

NO! Do <u>NOT</u> put these in your GREEN RECYCLING bin:

Batteries/Electronics Shredded Paper Tanglers (cords, hoses, wires, clothing) Food/Liquids; Trash and Bagged Recycling Furniture and Household Goods Scrap Wood and Scrap Metal (NO Helium Tanks) Yard Waste
