## CITIZENS ON PATROL – NOVEMBER 2024

Merry Christmas & Happy Holidays! We will be reporting a total of 29.75 patrol hours for the month of November. I love patrolling in December and will be making some nighttime patrols and checking out all the Christmas decorations and our neighborhood.

Let's try our best to keep 'crimes of opportunity' to a minimal. Keep your cars locked and if you cannot remove your valuable items; please keep them out of sight. Same goes for porch thieves, let's not give them the opportunity to steal our packages! Plan your deliveries by using pick-up locations, arrangements with neighbors or having items delivered to your work location.

Updates: I was really hoping the gated community on Jacquelyn had gotten their act together and were finally going to keep their trash cans behind their gates but unfortunately that only lasted one week. However, there are not quite so many, last count was 7 black cans and 2 of the green recycling cans. Our group of individuals hanging out at Long Point and Woodvine seems to be growing and setting up camp again. They even have a couple of recliners to lounge in! 

#### **DEED RESTRICTIONS**

Committee of Five

The Committee of Five tours the OSB neighborhood looking for violations of deed restrictions. Violation notice letters are sent to each resident that are not in compliance with the deed restrictions of their subdivision. If the address has not been given a copy of deed restrictions, a copy may be requested.

Most violations cease with a warning letter. However, OSB has residents in our Civic Association area that refuse to comply. The Committee may collect evidence such as photos and activity logs. This information may be filed after sufficient evidence is obtained for investigation. Not every investigation will result in litigation. The City Attorney's Office assists in Enforcement. The Neighborhood Services Section investigates complaints from residents and enforces written deed restrictions on the behalf of the City at no charge.

The Committee of Five has tried to work with residents over a long period of time. It is frustrating to try to understand why residents will not comply to the deed restrictions. We, as a committee want to encourage folks to respect the rules of the land. Your subdivision voted to accept these regulations in 1994. When you moved into your subdivision, you were automatically under these restrictions. These restrictions are in place to keep our neighborhood from looking trashy.

For what it is worth, most all OSB residents abide by their deed restrictions. However, we know of businesses being run out of homes. We hope to have the mayor's office inspection officer investigate those residents soon.

We appreciate those of you who are concerned with upholding the deed restrictions in one's respective subdivision. Thank you.

#### **BEAUTIFICATION**

It is important that OSB residents continue to follow City Codes and Deed Restrictions. If you still have violations, PLEASE get into compliance before an official shows up or you receive a letter from the Old Spring Branch Civic Association (OSBCA).

The newly built housing complex at 1923-1927 Jacquelyn Dr. are in violation of the City of Houston Ordinance concerning garbage bins and recycle bins being left on the street all the time, before and after collection. The housing complex even has named its own street, "Jacquelyn Oaks" with street addressed being in the 7300's. I do not know if this complex is made up of townhomes, duplexes, or apartments? WHO IS IN CHARGE AT THIS ADDRESS? I have been working with District A to eliminate the problem.

Reminder to residents, PLEASE place your recycling bins and garbage containers three to four (3' – 4') feet apart on collection day. Solid Waste JAWS need the space for successfully picking up and emptying the containers and to AVOID spillage. Sack all garbage. Do not sack recycling. Remove containers from the street the same day as collection. Store bins out of sight from the street per the City of Houston Ordinance. Please take the time to keep your yard, street, and ditches clear of litter.

## RECYCLING AND HEAVY TRASH PICK UP

#### **YES!** Put these in your GREEN RECYCLING bin:

- **Metal and Cans**: Aluminum and Tin Cans. Examples include soup cans, vegetable cans, fruit cans, coffee cans (emptied and rinsed)
- Cartons: Both gable top and shelf-stable food and beverage cartons. Examples include milk cartons, juice cartons, soup cartons, soy milk/alternative milk cartons (emptied and rinsed)
- Glass: Bottles, jugs and jars only (emptied and rinsed)
- Paper: Newspaper, magazines, catalogs, junk mail, office paper
- Cardboard: Cardboard and cereal boxes (emptied of packing materials and flattened)
- **Plastic**: Bottles, tubs and jugs #1 5 and 7. Examples include water and soda bottles, milk jugs, yogurt cups, margarine tubs, detergent bottles, shampoo bottles. (emptied and rinsed)

#### NO! Do NOT put these in your GREEN RECYCLING bin:

- Batteries/Electronics
- Shredded Paper
- Tanglers (cords, hoses, wires, clothing)
- Food/Liquids; Trash and Bagged Recycling
- Furniture and Household Goods
- Scrap Wood and Scrap Metal (NO Helium Tanks)
- Yard Waste
