This is a difficult reminder of how important it is to know those who live around us. Even having a simple point of contact for your neighbors can make a meaningful difference. If you notice unusual inactivity, a quick check-in could help someone in need.

Why Knowing Your Neighbors Matters

At its most basic level, knowing your neighbors helps create a safer environment. When people recognize each other, they are more likely to notice when something is out of place. Whether it's an unfamiliar car lingering too long or packages piling up on a porch, awareness increases when neighbors are paying attention.

A watchful, connected community often deters crime more effectively than cameras or alarms alone.

PROHIBITED YARD PARKING ORDINANCE

What Neighbors Need to Know

Background

At the March 10, 2009 meeting, Old Spring Branch Civic Association members voted unanimously to move forward with applying for a Prohibited Yard Parking Ordinance. The application has been prepared for submission to the City of Houston’s Planning and Development Department.

Notification Process

Residents will be officially notified by the City through a mailed notice. Additional updates will also be shared in *The Bugler* and through posted neighborhood signs.

Right to Protest

Property owners who wish to protest the ordinance will have up to 20 days from the date on the City’s notice letter to submit a written protest to the Planning and Development Department.

What the Ordinance Means

If approved, the ordinance will prohibit parking on grassy areas of residential properties, including front and side yards. All vehicles—cars, trucks, trailers, or anything with wheels—must be parked on a paved surface such as a concrete or asphalt driveway.

Enforcement

Violations will be considered a misdemeanor and may result in fines of up to \$150 per day.

Important Reminder

This ordinance does not replace existing deed restrictions. Rules still apply regarding the visibility of boats, trailers, campers, and similar vehicles, which should not be parked in view from the street.

Why It Matters

This effort helps maintain the appearance, safety, and property values of our neighborhood by keeping vehicles on designated paved areas and preserving the residential character of Old Spring Branch.

NORTHBROOK HIGH SCHOOL RISE PROGRAM MARKS FIRST GRADUATING CLASS



Residents zoned to Northbrook High School may be interested to learn about a recent milestone at the campus. This spring, the school recognized the first graduating class of its RISE College Academy, an early college program that allows students to complete college coursework while still enrolled in high school.

According to Spring Branch Independent School District, students in the inaugural cohort have completed the requirements to earn an associate degree in addition to their high school diploma. These students will participate in both a college graduation ceremony through Houston Community College and their high school commencement later this month.

About the RISE College Academy

The RISE program is designed as an early college pathway in which students take a combination of high school and college-level courses. Participants may earn up to 60 college credit hours, depending on their course progression and program completion.

Students typically divide their time between their high school campus and college classes. Admission into the program requires meeting academic eligibility criteria and completing an application process during high school.

Program Structure and Participation

While enrolled in RISE, students continue to participate in high school activities and organizations while managing the additional coursework required for college credit. The program is one of two early college options offered within SBISD, with a similar model also available at Spring Woods High School.

The first graduating cohort includes 44 students. A second group of students is currently participating in the program, continuing the early college model at Northbrook.

KNOW WHAT TO RECYCLE: WHAT GOES IN THE GREEN BIN

YES! You Can Recycle These:

- **Metal & Cans:** Aluminum and tin cans such as soup, vegetable, fruit, and coffee cans. *(Be sure to empty and rinse.)*
- **Cartons:** Both gable-top and shelf-stable food and beverage cartons like milk, juice, soup, and soy milk cartons. *(Empty and rinse.)*
- **Glass:** Bottles, jugs, and jars only. *(Empty and rinse.)*
- **Paper:** Newspapers, magazines, catalogs, junk mail, and office paper.
- **Cardboard:** Flattened cardboard boxes and cereal boxes. *(Remove all packing materials.)*
- **Plastic:** Bottles, tubs, and jugs numbered **#1–5 and #7**. Examples include water and soda bottles, milk jugs, yogurt cups, margarine tubs, detergent, and shampoo bottles. *(Empty and rinse.)*

NO! Keep These Out of the Green Bin:

- Batteries or electronics
- Shredded paper
- “Tanglers” such as cords, hoses, wires, and clothing
- Food, liquids, trash, or *bagged* recycling
- Furniture or household goods
- Scrap wood or scrap metal *(no helium tanks)*
- Yard waste
